TEST NAME	PURPOSE
BOG3	To establish a baseline measure of beginning third-grade students' English language arts/reading skills.
NC Check-Ins	To provide individual and classroom level formative feedback. The value of the NC Check-Ins results is for teachers to determine if their students have learned the content standards that were covered in their classroom prior to the assessments.
The North Carolina End-of-Grade Tests (EOG)	EOGs are designed to measure student proficiency on the goals, objectives, and grade-level competencies specified in the North Carolina Standard Course of Study. EOGs are used as 1 data point in assessing a student's proficiency in grade level standards.
North Carolina Final Exams (NCFE)	NCFEs are designed similar to EOGs, in that it measures student proficiency on goals, objectives, and grade-level competencies specified in the North Carolina Standard Course of Study.
Fall RTA (Read to Achieve)	RTA is an assessment given to third grade students who do not meet proficiency standards on the Reading /ELA EOG. Students are given 3 opportunities to take this assessment. Spring of third grade, Summer after third grade, and Fall of fourth grade. Students who receive a passing score on the RTA assessment will have met reading standards for third grade.
Math I End of Course Exam (EOC)	This EOC is designed to measure student proficiency on the goals, objectives, and grade-level competencies specified in the North Carolina Standard Course of Study for the Math I Course. Eighth grade students who were taught the Math 1 Curriculum will participate in the Math 1 EOC. These students will not take the 8 th grade Math EOG, only the Math EOC. This is considered a High School Math Course. EOC scores are used as 1 data point in assessing a student's proficiency in grade level standards.

Biology End of Course Exam (EOC)	The End-of-Course (EOC) Biology Test measures students' proficiency on the North Carolina Essential Standards for Biology, adopted by the North Carolina State Board of Education (NCSBE) in February 2010. NC State Board of Education Policy Requirements Regarding End-of-Course Assessments (TEST-003) directs schools to use the results from all operational EOC assessments as at least twenty percent (20%) of the student's final course grade. Test results will be used for school and district accountability under the accountability model and for federal reporting purposes
English II End of Course Exam (EOC)	The End-of-Course (EOC) English II Test measures students' reading proficiency on the North Carolina Standard Course of Study (NCSCoS) for English Language Arts, adopted by the North Carolina State Board of Education. NC State Board of Education Policy Requirements Regarding End-of-Course Assessments (TEST-003) directs schools to use the results from all operational EOC assessments as at least twenty percent (20%) of the student's final course grade. Test results will be used for school accountability under the accountability model and for federal reporting purposes
NCEExtend 1	This assessment is given to students who are taught curriculum based on the North

	<p>Carolina Extend 1 Standards. It is designed to measure student proficiency on the goals,</p>
	<p>objectives, and grade-level competencies specified in the NC Extend 1 Standards. This assessment is used as 1 data point in assessing a student's proficiency in grade level standards.</p>
<p>WIDA Screener</p>	<p>Language minority students are identified through the home-language survey process. This assessment is administered to all eligible, initially enrolled, language minority students within 30 calendar days at the beginning of the school year. This screener will determine if the student is eligible for English Language services.</p>
<p>ACCESS</p>	<p>All English Language (EL) students must be assessed annually to determine their progress and level of English Language proficiency. This is the state-designated EL proficiency test.</p>
<p>ACT</p>	<p>The ACT is a curriculum and standards-based assessment that evaluates eleventh graders' general learning outcomes in English, mathematics, reading and science. It is used as a college admissions and placement test and is accepted by all four-year colleges and universities in the United States.</p>
<p>PreACT</p>	<p>PreACT administered to all tenth graders. The PreACT simulates the ACT testing experience by providing students early exposure to ACT test -quality questions. The Pre ACT is reported on the same 1-36 score scale as the ACT, but PreACT has a maximum score of 35. The PreACT also provides a predicted ACT composite score range.</p>
<p>ACT WorkKeys</p>	<p>Students who are identified as CTE concentrators are required to complete the ACT WorkKeys assessments. The three ACT WokKeys assessments - Applied Math, Graphic Literacy and Workplace Documents are the basis of the ACT WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate (ACT WorkKeys NCRC) program.</p>
